Enrichment Session Dates:

- Enrichment classes meet Monday - Thursday over the course of six to eight weeks.
- Please refer to your confirmation email regarding class dates, as some will have a later start date than others. Please note, dates are subject to change due to weather and other unforeseen circumstances.
- Some Friday enrichment classes will meet regardless of the Friday schedule.

Policies

- Limited space is available in each of these classes. At the time of registration, your child's name is entered into a lottery for the class(es) of choice. Please do not assume enrollment in these classes until you receive an email confirmation from the After School Director.
- Fees for these classes are NON-REFUNDABLE. You are committed when you sign up for the class.
- Before the summer break, parents will receive a confirmation email with the planned class dates. You may drop the class in the allotted time period stated in the email.
- Meadowbrook accounts *may be* billed PRIOR to the first class meeting.
- Meadowbrook reserves the right to cancel an enrichment class due to under-enrollment, at which time Meadowbrook accounts will be refunded.
- Class dates may change due to unforeseen scheduling conflicts or inclement weather. Make-up classes will be scheduled when possible. Parents will be notified by email of rescheduled events.
- Students who are contracted for After School during their chosen enrichment classes are sometimes eligible for discounted Enrichment pricing. See descriptions for details.

FAQ:

Does my child need to be contracted for After School in order to enroll in an enrichment class?

No, you can enroll in an enrichment class without being contracted for After School. Please be aware that you will need to pick up your child at the 3:10 Lower School dismissal when the class does not meet. Middle School students will need to be picked up at the 4:20 Middle School dismissal. A confirmation email will be sent with the scheduled class dates so you're aware of when to pick up your child.

Does my JK student have to be in After School before participating in their enrichment class?

Yes, your JK student must be contracted for After School until 3:10 on the day of their scheduled enrichment class. You do not need to contract Fridays to participate because students will be dismissed straight to their After School teachers and then on to their enrichment class. Remember you can make changes to your After School contract during the first two weeks of school.

How will my child get to and from their enrichment class?

An After School teacher will pick up your child from their classroom and deliver them to their enrichment class. At the end of the enrichment class, either the Enrichment instructor or an After School teacher will bring your child to After School or Study Hall (if contracted) or get them ready for dismissal.

Is a snack provided for students enrolled in an enrichment class?

*Yes, snacks are provided at the start of each enrichment class scheduled Monday-Thursday. Students will have ample space to safely eat before their class begins. *Snack is not provided before a Friday Enrichment as the students will have just eaten lunch.*
